Frequent Stayer Winners June 2021

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Australia is once again in turmoil with peak hour traffic and overflowing camp sites in the north and lockdowns and empty parks in the south. When will it end? Shall we go or stay? A question we are hearing a lot of these days!

Needless to say many 1000's have been able to get out of the south into the northern areas to enjoy QLD, NT & WA!. However, many are now waiting for the situation to improve down South, especially out East. Our thoughts and prayers are with those in NSW and we really hope for a quick resolution and return to normality for you all.



Last Sunday morning at 08.35 we left Goondiwindi, QLD to make the 24 hour dash across NSW to Wodonga Victoria. Because of the RED zone in NSW, we had a limit of just 24 hours to cross from QLD to VIC (a requirement of the VIC Govt). We arrived at 9.11 Monday morning, after the deadline !!!!!. Thankfully the Police were very gracious and understanding, knowing we had made the attempt and had arrived safely. Needless to say, this was a crazy experience! To achieve this feat with our 2.8 ton Scenic Caravan, Ford Ranger, increased speed of around 100km, 20% increase in fuel consumption (and cost), headwind and some rain, we arrived safe and sound. We drove for nearly 12 hours on the Sunday and 3 hours on the Monday with the needed stops and sleep over. Then we had another 3 hours to travel to Melbourne.


There is little doubt it was an exhausting experience and **not one I would recommend** unless absolutely necessary.

We went to Goondiwindi to start the journey as this was one of the shortest distances (1016km) between QLD and VIC. Some thoughts if you are considering the journey....

If you can stay in QLD longer till the situation improves, do so!

- If you have to travel...get your VIC Border Permit. We needed an Orange Permit to enter, and had to do a Covid test within 72 hours on arrival (all good we made it and are clear).
- You must avoid close contact. The Police said they were more understanding of Caravanners as they have their own facilities and places to sleep and be self contained.
- Drive on a Sunday - definitely the quietest time on the Newell Highway.
- Leave QLD with empty toilet cassette and enough water and food. We stopped for take aways en-route and coffees. We took the odd 15 minute Power nap.
- Take a day or 2 to chill before heading off
- It is manageable, however, I would suggest that you continue enjoying QLD while you can!

This too will change and you will get home!


